Neurology defines an author as a person who has made a substantive intellectual contribution to the submitted manuscript. A substantive contribution includes one or more of the following:

Design or conceptualization of the study

Analysis or interpretation of the data

Drafting or revising the manuscript for intellectual content

Professional writers employed by pharmaceutical companies or other academic, governmental, or commercial entities who have drafted or revised the intellectual content of the paper must be included as authors.

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What happens when women stop MS treatment during pregnancy? *Two studies show possible effects for mom and baby*

Two new studies look at the effects of stopping the newer, stronger drug natalizumab for multiple sclerosis (MS) during pregnancy. "Pregnancy planning can be difficult when a woman has MS because she and her physician must weigh the risks vs the benefits of medications that control MS disease activity," said study author Emilio Portaccio, MD, of the Don Carlo Gnocchi Foundation in Florence, Italy. "Our findings suggest that if women who take natalizumab for MS want to become pregnant, it may be best to continue treatment up until a pregnancy test is positive and then at that point discontinue use."
