In a recent article in *Neurology: Clinical Practice*, Terman et al.¹ used the State Inpatient Databases to describe factors associated with 30-day readmission for patients hospitalized for seizures. Another recent article by Robbins et al.² analyzed data of payments from industry to US neurologists and found that 9,505 neurologists (there are about 14,000 neurologists in the US) received at least 1 payment from industry each year with most receiving <\$1,000. Drs. Albert and Kim also contributed an editorial about this paper.³ Finally, don't miss the article by Baskin et al.⁴ about the efforts by the journal to promote perspectives of equity, diversity, and inclusion and address disparities, and the article by Dr. Silver about understanding and addressing gender equity for women in neurology.⁵
